

## E. Sustainable Sanitation and Hygiene for All (SSH4A)

The SSH4A project, 4-year project (Sept. 2014 until August 2018), is being funded by SVN-Nepal. The over-all goal is to provide the community with access to sanitation and hygiene. The project covers 13 VDCs: Lekhparajul, Chinchu, Dharapani, Bajendichour, Dandakhali, Kafalkot and Ghoreta in Surkhet district.



The project has supported for the 10 establishment of hygiene use of toilet and hand wash with soap as well as total sanitation;

2) installation of toilets; 3) campaign on sanitation and hygiene through mass media and drama; 4) support to stakeholder on governance; 5) support to school clubs and various community based groups.

## F. Expanding Nepalese and Bhutanese Access to Indian Technologie for Agriculture (ENBAITAA) Programme

ENBAIT program is supported by USAID and India partnership. The project focuses on sharing of Indian experuebcas in improving agriculture, food and nutritional security through sustained application of innovations and best practices. The objective is to build and strengthen private sector supply chains for climate smart technologies and other agriculture input and sustainably increase agriculture incomes of the farmers. The working VDC are: Birendranagar and Bheriganga municipality, Lekhparajul, Satakhani, Gadi, Salkot, Babiyachaur, Vidyapur VDCs of Surkhet district.

## G. Agriculture and Food Security project (AFSP)



The programme is being funded by FAO-UN to support the Agriculture and Food Security Project (AFSP) of Nepal Government. The program aims to address the problem on food security due to poor agricultural growth and production, decline on national agricultural and livestock priority, and global climate change. The project covrs 10 VDCs in Surkhet district.

## H. Solar Multiple Use Water Systems for Sustainable Livelihood Project (Solar MUS II)

The project aims to create income and livelihood opportunities for rural household through solar-powered system that will provide sufficient water for domestic use and agricultural purposes. Combined with other appropriate services such as capacity building, market linkages and agricultural traininigs.

## I. Rural Water Supply and Sanitation Program

The program promotes demand-driven community based approach in water supply and sanitation sector in surkhet by mobilizing non-governmental and private sector organizations in assisting communities to implement water supply and sanitation schemes. Project areas are: Matela, Satakhani, Lekhparajul, Malarani and Bijaura VDCs in Surkhet district.

## J. Promotion of Forest-Based Enterprises Programme



The Multi-Stakeholder Forestry Program (MSFP), funded by the government of Finland, Switzerland and UK, is implemented by BNA in partnership with HBTL and Surkhet and Jumla. The project assisted 30 CFUGS in Surkhet and 20 CFUGS in Jumla. The project has delivered the following: 1) establishment of 7 new enterprises (i.e. dhatelo oil, essential oil, densified bio-briquette, and NTFP storage and trading); 2) strengthening of 5 existing enterprises (i.e. chiuri butter, medicinal herbal tea, essential oil); 3) strengthening 50 LFG's governance; 4) employment generated through income generating activities.

## K. Poverty Alleviation Program

The objective of the project is to improve the living condition through livelihood and empowerment of the rural poor, with particular attentaion to groups that have been traditionally exluded by reasons of gender, ethnicity, caste and location. The program has focused on income generation and infrastructure activities. The target areas are: Lagam, Betan, Bijaura, Gutu, Ghatgaun and Tatapani VDCs of Surkhet district.

## Current Projects

### A. Promoting Agriculture, Health and Alternative Livelihoods (PAHAL)

The PAHAL Program is a five-year program that commenced on November 2014 funded by USAID-FFP. It seeks to strengthen livelihoods, improve nutritional status and increase the capacity of vulnerable households to mitigate, adapt to and recover from shocks and stresses in communities with deep poverty and high rates of malnutrition in critical zones of the Mid-Western Surkhet.



The target working VDCs are: Phase 1: Lekparajul, Dharapani, Ranibas, Kafalkot, Rajena, and Neta; Phase 2: Ghatgaun, Tatapani, Chhapre, Lagam, Betan, and Bijaura

### B. Sajhedari Bikaas Partnership for Local Development Project

The partnership with Pact Nepal / USAID began on 2015 for the Phase 2 project implementation. The main goal of the project is to increase motivation of communities through active participation, governance and GESI in the implementation of developmental projects with local bodies.



A total of 13 VDCs in Surkhet district targeted and BNA cover Lagam, Betan, Bijaura, Babiychaur and Chhapre VDC.

### C. BRACED (Building Resilient and Adaptation to Climate Extremes and Disasters) Project - Anukulan

The goal of the project is to build the resilience of poor and vulnerable people, especially women and children to climate change impacts, landslides and drought. The program started on January 2015 until December 2017 and is funded by DFID.



The project covers 17 VDCs in Surkhet district: Tatapani, Taranga, Kunathari, Hariharpur, Lekgaun, Gadhi, Lekhparajuli, Chhinchu, Maintada, Mehelkuna, Sahare, Malarani, Dharapani, Ghumkhahare, Dahachaur, Khaanikhola and Bajedichaur.

### D. Strengthening Small Holder Enterprise



The overall goal of the project is to improve the livelihood of smallholder rural families through agri-livestock based on value chain enterprises development approach. Targeting 1,700 households in Kunathari VDC, Surkhet.

The project is supported by Heifer International Nepal. The project has provided the following support: 1) goat sheds 2) cattle sheds 3) vegetable seeds 4) crop seeds 5) local poultry 6) improved cooking stoves 7) fodder/forage 8) agriculture equipment 9) vaccines and animal improvement

support for capacity building of the community on livestock, small holder farmer support and co-operative management.
